OUR CODE OF CONDUCT

The **CODE OF CONDUCT** is part of our **HOME SCHOOL AGREEMENT**. Children are asked to make an effort with many aspects of their learning and following the school's code of conduct is number one. It is displayed around the school and is simplified to the main headings for younger children.

Take Care of Yourself

Never

- Do anything silly or dangerous where you might be hurt or hurt others.
- Stay in the school building at break times, or leave the school building without permission.
- Talk to strangers in school unless they are wearing a yellow school visitors' badge.

Always

- Tell someone if you are unhappy

Take Care of Others

Never

- Do anything to hurt others physically, verbally or emotionally (such as hitting, name calling or social networking/cyber bullying)
- Distract others from working
- Be cheeky or rude to adults

Always

- Be respectful, polite and friendly to visitors, newcomers and other children

Take Care of Our School

Never

- Steal or deliberately damage school equipment
- Drop litter or deface the school building
- Give the school a bad name

Always

- Be proud of our school and each other

UNIFORM RULES

- All children should be in uniform.
- Long hair should be tied back.
- Hair accessories to be plain and the same colour as the uniform.
- No extreme hairstyles or colour.
- No nail varnish — keep this for holidays and weekends. We have nail varnish remover in school and children will be asked to remove it.
- Plain white, grey or black socks or tights to be worn.
- **NO JEWELLERY OF ANY DESCRIPTION** (this includes earrings) *Children with pierced ears may wear plastic posts during school hours obtainable from the school office. If you provide your own plastic earrings, they should be small.*
- Religious/faith bangles must be protected with a tubi - grip at all times.
- Children may wear a watch, if they can tell the time, but it must be removed for PE, outdoor activities and break.
- ALL uniform must be named with an indelible pen or sew in label so that it can be found and returned.
- Sensible school shoes should be worn. (NO HEELIES OR ASTROTURF SOLES)
- A draw-string bag to be brought into school containing socks, change of shoes, underwear and a t-shirt in case of a change in the weather.

School

The school will make every effort to:

- Ensure the safety, security, emotional and physical well-being of pupils whilst in our care
- Ensure pupils receive the legal entitlement of a broad and balanced curriculum whether face to face or remotely
- Ensure pupils achieve their potential
- Promote high standards and high expectations of effort and attainment
- Promote a policy of good behaviour and positive relationships
- Provide properly planned, weekly homework opportunities which are realistic, achievable and related to work in school
- Provide opportunities for extra-curricular activities
- Provide a written **report informing parents of their child's** progress at least once per year and provide opportunities for discussion with the class teacher at least twice per year
- Deal with parental concerns promptly and inform parents of how they have been resolved
- Keep parents well informed about school life and special events through regular newsletters, email, the website and correspondence.
- Uphold all safeguarding expectations and requirements in accordance with Keeping Children Safe in Education September 2022.
